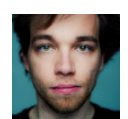

# There are no more parrot misunderstandings, the official list of the Hungarian names of all species has been completed

This spring, we published an interview [with parrot researcher György Oláh](#), who at the time was researching the illegal global parrot trade, and was also involved in making documentaries about birds.

Since then, Oláh, who works in the natural sciences department of the BBC, has also participated in the birth of a Hungarian publication: the [article he wrote together with Attila Bankovics](#), available on the website of the Hungarian Biological Society, in which they undertook to record the names of all known parrot species in Hungarian. As Oláh said, it is common for incorrect names to appear on the internet and, as a result, in the press, often with mirrored or unofficial versions, and this makes it difficult for readers in the field who are interested in the species, but it can also cause problems if someone buys from a breeder. a parrot for home.

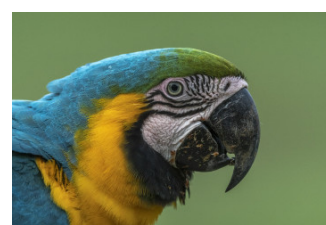
Their unconcealed goal with their article is precisely to make the existence of the official list better integrated into the public consciousness, and from now on professional translators, editors and breeders should also use it when writing about parrots.
